Page 7 in the UncerCover Strip Book using Hoffman Bali Pops™.

ADD: Cut 40 units 2½" x 8½" from Red/Orange Strips

Need help figuring out which fabrics to cut into what sizes?
 This is a guide to help you. These are not the exact same cuts
 I made when creating this quilt, but it's pretty darn close!
 Feel free to mix it up when you create your own, though.

5 Pale Lavenders



5 Greens/Green-Browns



5 strips of cream/pale green



Cut 20 rectangles 2.5" x 4.5". Cut 6 units from each strip. Then cut one 8 ½" rectangle from one of the remnants.

Pair the 4 ½" rectangles (purple with green) together.

Cut 20 rectangles 2.5" x 4.5". Cut 5 units from each strip.

This pieced unit goes in the center of the block.

Cut 40 rectangles 2.5" x 4.5"

These are the rectangles that are paired with the Red/Orange/Gold 8 ½" Rectangles as shown in diagram on page 7 You should have ½ strip left over after cutting..

If you cut according to these pages, you will have 39 units 8 ½”long and 37 units 4 ½”long. You need 40 of each size. Add the 8 ½”unit cut on page one to complete the 40 units you will need. Cut an additional 3 units 4 ½” long from the remnants of strips you have already cut (on page 1). The strips cut from *this* page plus the extra 3 units cut from remnants (on page 1) should total 40.

Add 2 strips of Red/Orange to this group. From each strip cut (3) 8½”and (3) 4½”rectangles.

The 4½” rectangles are paired with the 8 ½”purple rectangles as shown on page 7. The 8 ½”rectangles are paired with the 4 ½”cream/pale green rectangles as shown on page 7.

The 4 ½” rectangles are paired with the 8 ½” purple rectangles. The 8 ½”rectangles are to be paired with the 4 ½”cream/lt grn rectangles.

NOTE:
It is very important to press in the direction of the grainlines during construction of the block to prevent stretching of the fabric and distortion of the block.



From each strip
cut 5 units $2\frac{1}{2}''\times$
 $8\frac{1}{2}''$.



From these strips
cut an additional
10 units $2\frac{1}{2}''\times$ $8\frac{1}{2}''$.

I hope seeing the fabrics and
breaking the cutting instructions
down like this has helped!
If you use the strongest colors
in the $8\frac{1}{2}''$ portions your diamonds
will “pop” but don’t hesitate to
play with where you place your
fabrics, values and colors. That
is what makes a scrappy quilt so
fun. Remember, it IS scrappy and
so you will find yourself putting
some “red” fabrics where you may
think a “purple” or “gold” should
go. Don’t worry. Use a design wall
if you are feeling like you need a
little more control over placement.
